

## ROOM SET-UP

Place pieces of broken stone and rock at a focal point in the room. Write parts of the Ten Commandments on these rocks. These broken stones represent the tablets Moses broke after he saw the Israelites worshipping the golden calf. At the end of the lesson, pass out the broken rock to students to remind them to follow God's requirements.
